

Sputnik	First artificial Earth satellite, it was launched by Moscow in 1957 and sparked U.S. fears of Soviet dominance in technology and outer space


The Moon Landing



- NASA officials selected Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins as the astronauts who would make the historic trip from Earth on Apollo 11. Just four days after launching from Kennedy Space Center in Florida, the spacecraft neared the moon's surface.
- On the 21st of July 1969, was a historic day for the whole world! Neil Armstrong took the first steps for men who walked on the moon. At 2:56am, he stepped out of the Apollo 11 lunar module and onto the Moon's surface, in an area of the moon called the Sea of Tranquillity.
- Following Armstrong, **Buzz Aldrin**, became the second man to walk on the moon seconds later.
- After the two stepped onto the lunar surface, **Armstrong** proclaimed these

NASA	National Aeronautics and Space Administration	famous words: "That's one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind."	
		When Apollo 11 landed on the moon for the first time, astronauts planted an American flag to mark the occasion.	
Space Race			

The Space Race was a competition of space exploration between the Soviet Union (now Russia) and the United States, which lasted from 1955 to 1969. The Space Race began after the Soviet launch of Sputnik 1 on 4 October 1957. The term "Space Race" started as a comparison to the arms race. The Space Race became an important part of the rivalry between the United States and the Soviet Union during the Cold War. Space technology became an extra important area in this rivalry, because of possible military uses.
