Guy Fawkes



- Found with fuses and matches on November 5th 1605.
- He was arrested for treason as it was found out he was plotting to blow up the Houses of Parliament with a group of Catholics.
- He was a very clever man.

King James 1



- Became king in 1603
- King of Scotland and became King of England at the time of The Gunpowder Plot.
- King James I was an unpopular king who was known to be selfish and did not care for the opinions of others.
